

CODE OF CONDUCT TRIBUNAL COMMITTEE | PENALTIES REFERENCE GUIDE

QRL Rules Part 5, 5.5.1 Jurisdiction of the Code of Conduct Review Committee and Code of Conduct Tribunal

A Code of Conduct Review Committee and Code of Conduct Tribunal has jurisdiction to deal with the following conduct of a Person or Club: -

- **a)** Failure to comply with any Rule, policies, procedures or directions of the QRL or an Administration Unit (including the NRL Code of Conduct);
- **b)** Offering or receiving a bonus or inducement to win, lose or draw a match;
- c) Conduct which is or is likely to bring the Game into disrepute;
- **d)** Using any form of media including social media, radio broadcasts, newspapers and otherwise to publish a personal opinion which is detrimental to the Game, players, officials or any other "Sub Ordinate" (as defined in these Rules).
- **e)** Disorderly, insulting or objectionable conduct by a club member, coach, team official, spectator or member of the public generally at a match under the control of an Administration Unit, including on-field incidents involving such persons e.g., an on-field coach who is sent from the field by the referee for disorderly conduct or a spectator/parent who enters the field of play;
- **f)** Allowing any player not registered or under suspension or disqualification to take part in any match;
- **g)** Arranging or taking part in any match with any Club, team, representative team or Region not affiliated with the QRL without the QRL's written consent;
- **h)** Knowingly allowing an unqualified Person or an unregistered player to take part in an Administration Unit's competition without the necessary approval;
- i) Action considered to be in breach of any endorsed positive behaviour program; or
- j) Breaching any material terms of the NRL Code of Conduct



QRL Rules Part 5, 5.5.7 Decisions of Code of Conduct Tribunal

Penalties may include, but are not limited to:

- Suspension of a match and/or
- o Termination of a match (including potential forfeiture of competition points and/or
- o Monetary Fines and/or
- o Suspension of a participant on a temporary or permanent basis and/or
- o Suspension of a Club, League or Association on a temporary or permanent basis
- o Revocation or suspension of an accreditation issued by the National Rugby League (NRL) or relevant governing body.
- Education programs
 - o Cultural awareness
 - Match Official online training
 - Child Protection
 - Anger management
 - Positive Environment Program
 - o Other

These penalties are in addition to any penalty which may be imposed by the relevant governing League bodies.



This guide references multiple levels of potential consequences and each carry the corresponding PEP demerit points if found guilty:

Proven Breach	Demerit points	Guide
Disciplinary low charge	1	Abusive
Disciplinary medium charge	2	Threatening
Disciplinary high charge	3	Physical
Competition rule breach	1	Any

PLEASE NOTE: This is a Reference Guide to assist our Tribunal Members and to let the Rugby League community know the recommended consequences and parameters for inappropriate behaviour in our game. The Tribunal may apply the below examples to any incident.

CODE OF CONDUCT BREACHES – In relation to the Positive Environment Program

This table provides the RECOMMENDED minimum penalty to be applied for each offence. Normal Match Review, Judiciary and Code of Conduct process applies as per the QRL rules for an offender to be found guilty.

MEDIUM CHARGE (Threatening)

o Penalties may vary from 2-month suspension / exclusion to 2 years, applied only to the Region where the incident occurs.
